RULES

- All Junior Fair Cattle must be in place by 7 AM, July 20.
- All cattle must be halter broken and easily handled in order to show in the Junior Fair.
- All cattle may be tied out after 7 PM in the proper area; they must have both a rope halter and neck rope when tied out. No loose cattle in the tie-out area. All cattle must be removed from tie out area by 9 AM. Immediately following tie out stalls must be cleaned and prepared for the next day. There is to be no stacked straw inside tie out area.
- A beef exhibitor's meeting will be held on Monday, July 20 @ 7:30 AM in the Sales Arena. Attendance is mandatory.
- All Junior Fair Cattle will be released at 11 PM, following the conclusion of the Junior Fair Large Animal Sale.
- Pen and Tie Out Space will be assigned by the department directors.
- Only 1 grooming chute per exhibitor in the barn. Grooming Chute in the barn must have fair permit sticker attached or will be removed to the outside of the barn.

Division A - Breeding Beef

July 25 @ Sales Arena

- Judging will be held on Saturday, July 25 at 9 AM in the Sales Arena prior to the Open Show.
- Breeding Beef must be owned by May 15 of current year.
- Breeding Promotion-- To qualify for a premium, an exhibitor must exhibit the breeding project at the Fair.
- All animals must be purebred and recorded with their association to show in a breed, and must be registered in the exhibitor's name. Commercial heifers may be purebred (not registered) or crossbred beef animals.
- All purebred and commercial breeds will be recognized. Classes will be divided by committee based on participation. Registration required day of show if asked.
- All Junior Fair beef exhibits must be in place between the hours 12 AM and 7:30 AM, July 25. All Junior Fair beef breeding will be released on Saturday following the show.

Classes:

- 222. Heifer Calf - Calved between Sept. 1, 2019 & April 30, 2020.
- 223. Yearling Heifer - Calved between Sept. 1, 2018 & Aug. 31, 2019.
- 224. 2-Year-Old Heifer - Calved between May 1, 2018 & Aug. 31, 2019.
- 225. Bull - Calved between May 1, 2019 and Jan. 1, 2020.

Division B – Market Beef

July 21 @ Sales Arena

- Judging will be held on Tuesday, July 21 in the Sales Arena immediately followed by the showmanship contest. Market Dairy Beef will show on Wednesday, July 22 following the Dairy Feeder Show.

- All Market Beef must be owned by December 1 and identified on December 2, 2019.
- Exhibitors may tag up to 5 Market Beef animals at the December 1 weigh-in.
- Market Heifers may be tagged and will be shown in Market Beef classes at the Fair with the steers.
- All Market beef are recommended to be 425 - 850 pounds at weigh-in on December 1, 2019.
- Market Beef are to be in place by 7 AM, July 20 and will be assigned to the proper weight classes following the weigh-in on Monday, July 20 at 8 AM. Animals are not to be “shrunk” for this weigh-in.
- All market beef must weigh at least 1000 pounds to show in the Junior Fair Market Beef contest. Market Dairy Beef must weigh at least 1000 pounds to show and sell.
- All breeds will show together, with the exception of Market Dairy Beef. Market Dairy Beef may be purebred or crosses of only dairy breeds. Beef/Dairy crosses will show in the beef show. There will be a maximum of 10 Market Beef in each class.
- Exhibitors may show a maximum of 2 market beef in the regular Junior Fair Market Beef Show.
- All Market Beef will be entered in the Rate of Gain Contest.
- All Market Beef must be dehorned, castrated, and healed by weigh-in on December 1, 2019.
- Market Beef exhibitors showing 2 market beef projects will be given the option to sell both animals in the Junior Fair Premium Sale. There is still a limit of 2 times through the Sale Ring, Market Beef is the only species allowed to sell twice in the same species.

- 227A. Fayette County Born and Raised Steer
- 227B. Market Dairy Beef
- 228. Rate of Gain

Division C - Beef Showmanship

July 21 @ Sales Arena

- Beef Showmanship is mandatory for all market beef exhibitors. Exceptions will only be made in extreme cases. Any previous senior winner has option to participate.
- Anyone not participating will forfeit his or her right to sell in the steer sale.
- Judging will be held on Tuesday, July 21 following the steer show.

Classes:

- 228. Grades 11 and above
- 229. Grades 9 and 10
- 230. Grades 7 and 8
- 231. Grades 5 and 6
- 232. Grades 3 and 4

Overall Beef Showman- Champion Market Steer Showman and Champion Feeder Showman compete for Overall Beef Showman and must go to Showman to Showman
