- 3. All family and consumer sciences projects are to be displayed in a club booth or in the locked area in the Youth Building. Exceptional cases should be brought to the attention of the Youth Building advisor.
- 4. Booths are to be decorated on July 13 between the hours of 9 AM 12:00 PM. All booths must be completed by 12:00 PM on July 13.
- 5. All exhibits are to be removed from booths on Saturday, July 20 from 12 PM 2 PM. Exhibits may not be removed earlier. All exhibits which remain after the fair will become the property of the Fayette County Agricultural Society.
- 6. NO PARENT OR RELATIVE IS PERMITTED TO TALK WITH A JUDGE AT ANY TIME, UNLESS SPECIAL PERMISSION IS GIVEN BY THE EXTENSION EDUCATOR IN CHARGE OF JUDGING.
